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- Hatch 4 Schools: In February, 6 spritely chicks hatched in an incubator in Paula's room. We looked after them carefully until they were bigger and then the farmer who runs the 'hatch4schools' programme came to tell us about raising hens and he took them back to join their family on the farm in Inagh, Co. Clare. We all loved seeing the chicks grow and were amazed at how much energy they had after only a few hours outside the egg. All children wanted to name the chicks so they wrote and submitted name suggestions and prizes were awarded for creative names and explanations.
- Plant Sale: After Easter, don't be surprised to see hundreds of green shoots growing by our windowsills. We are planning another plant sale during the last term where you will be able to purchase herbs, bedding plants, sunflowers, house plants etc., all planted by the children and teachers.
- Healthy eating: We are in the process of updating our healthy eating policy. Did you know that children can consume up to 1/3 of their daily food intake in school? We firmly believe that these foods should be as healthy as possible so that your child develops good habits that will stay with them throughout their life, as well as keeping them well and receptive to learning. We notice that some children's lunchboxes contain only processed foods (i.e. those in wrappers). While they may be convenient, these foods are often laden with sugar, fat and salt. Preferred natural options are fruit and vegetables (perhaps cut into fun shapes) and brown bread sandwiches with the child's choice of filling. Teachers will be drawing children's attention to lunches during the last term. For more ideas, look at the safefood.eu website (healthy lunchboxes).
